



July 28Th , 2025 Meeting Minutes

- We are in the process of setting up a flea market in collaboration with the church for Fall Fea market. No date set yet, but not in July. \$40 for 4 spots already collected. Suggested making a large S.H.A.G poster to hang at events. The new Forest Park website can do this for a fee.
- The 127 yard sale (A.K.A world's longest flea market) is August 7~10th this year. We are in the process of securing a location at The InStyle Barber Shop, 10806 Hamilton by this Wednesday. Suggested selling prepackaged food because no time for permit. \$150 approved if we can pull this off.
- Went over the rules from Hamilton county board of health for serving prepared food as a temporary food service. Must apply for permit 10 days in advance. \$65 processing fee. Hand wash station can be as simple as an old coffee maker with water in it and a 5 gallon bucket to catch along with soap. 3 foil pans (wash rinse sanitize) for dishes. A thermometer for some foods such as burgers and fish. Also mention liability, Safety level ratings for different foods, along with experience of Health department shutting down a fundraiser at a baseball game in Forest Park for not getting a permit. Selling prepackaged food such as vending machine sized snacks do not need permit.
- Movie night at the park at the park shelter had a low turnout but was successful. The Township sponsors Moonlight Movie nights at different parks through ArtsConnect program.
- Lisa Young has been campaigning for November township election and mention many people in our neighborhood are not registered to vote, looking for ideas to get more registered.
- Maria is planning to run for Township Trustee on the November ballot and looking for support. We helped with ballot signatures needed to get approved.
- Sevenhills Park sign with landscaping is complete at Mistyhill playground entrance.
- Sand Volleyball court construction in progress and should be finished by end of July early August.
- Street light in park by playground on Mistyhill is fixed. Duke said any pole with electric can have a streetlight installed, and paid for by township or homeowner at \$8 per month. Suggested a light at basketball court, but safety was a concern due to after dark activity at park.
- A grant from SORTA was reapplied by township for a Bus Pull off at the 17 EOL on Roosevelt along with repaving of Sprucehill and other adjacent roads. Should be approved by mid-August.
- The temporary construction site at the old Kmart lot on Waycross in Forest Park is almost moved out.
- Habitat for Humanity purchased the empty lot on Sevenhills Dr. and building new house at location.
- Street light on Pleasanthill fixed.
- Alge, weeds, tree limbs a problem on some rental properties. Suggested report to Captain Stein, Code Enforcement.
